beans!

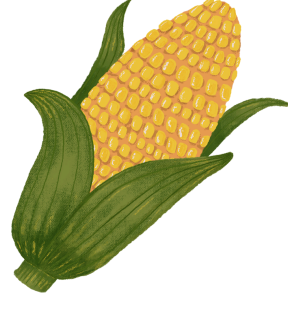
1. Cut out the bean pods and leaves.

5. Glue on squash
