Instructions

You'll need:

- 1 school notebook (included)
- 1 chalkboard (included)
- Chalk (included)
- Pencil (included)

READING: Open your school notebook to the first set of pages titled "Reading." In schools of the past students read aloud while their teacher listened to correct any mispronunciations. Practice reading the story "The Wolf" aloud now. In the past, stories that children read had clear morals that taught life lessons along side how to read. What do you think the moral of "The Wolf" is? If you want to practice your memorization and recitation like children would have done in one room schoolhouses, see if you can recite one of the passages of "The Wolf" without looking down

PENMANSHIP: Flip to the next page. Using your pencil, practice your very best penmanship on the guided lines. Why do you think handwriting was so important for schoolchildren to perfect? Is it as important now?

ARITHMETIC: Flip to the next page. Solve the arithmetic problems on your chalkboard. While you have your chalkboard out, you can practice your penmanship. Is it harder or easier to write with chalk?

VENN DIAGRAM: Use the Venn diagram provided to compare and contrast the school you go to today, whether it's public, private, or at home, and schools of the past. What's the same? What's different?
