## **WORDS TO KNOW!**

- **Loom:** A device or machine for weaving cloth
- **Warp:** The threads on a loom that go vertically, or up and down, and act as the foundation of a fabric
- **Weft:** The threads that are woven over and under the warp threads going horizontally, or left to right
- Selvage: The sides of a weaving that run parallel to the warp threads (they should be kept even)
- Fiber: A long, thin thread of material like wool or cotton
- Yarn: Fibers that have been twisted into thicker strands
- Shuttle: The tool, shaped a bit like a boat, that holds the weft
- Mill: A building where raw materials like cotton and wool are turned into thread, yarn, fabric, clothing, blankets, etc.
